We pledge to support tourism and hospitality businesses by helping them to understand the importance of making changes that reduce environmental impact. Over a defined three year period, Visit Tamar Valley will:

Raise the visibility of sustainable tourism businesses in the Tamar Valley on the Visit Tamar Valley website, making them easy for visitors to identify and engage with.

Enable businesses to showcase their green-action initiatives and processes via a dedicated section of their listing page, as well as provide space for member businesses to add their award badges.

Make it easy for visitors to identify and engage with sustainable businesses in the Tamar Valley through enhanced website filtering.

Join the Green Tourism scheme and work towards achieving Silver Award status by 2024. Carry out consumer marketing campaigns to promote the importance of sustainable travel helping visitors to understand and reduce the impact of their stay or visit on the local area.

Help tourism businesses to find local suppliers of renewable energy, environmentally friendly products and produce, recycling, and environmentally friendly waste services.

Deliver a programme of training workshops to help businesses to embark on, or continue to develop their own green initiatives.

Provide a forum for businesses to share ideas, share best practices, network and offer peer support.

Work with key partners to promote public transport links, and activities such as cycling and walking, allowing visitors to get about whilst enhancing their experience of the area.

Develop and publish a Sustainable Tourism Charter for the Tamar Valley by the end of 2025.

By implementing these measures over the coming years, Visit Tamar Valley will be able to promote environmentally friendly practices, help tourism businesses and visitors to reduce their impact on the environment, and support sustainable tourism, which benefits both the environment and local communities.
