What a year 2023 has been! The new air-source heating system in Harvey is complete. Lizzy's brother Richard came to lend a hand to install the heat-pump. Harvey is now beautifully warm, so we're pleased Dave's months of hard work has paid off.

As usual there's a recycled element; the hot water tank shelter is constructed with panels from a redundant coldstore in Saltash that was being demolished. The green roof is bordered with slate from our

station roof, taken off when we had the solar panels installed. We'll also be planting a green roof over the newly erected heat-pump shelter. All we need now is some cold weather.





We started the year with a open day. This was a great success. As well as looking around the carriages and our photo displays, visitors were able to enjoy our woodland snowdrop walk.

A fine array of refreshments were served up by our friends Donna and Kelly, which, along with donations for books and plants, raised over £500 for good causes, including St Germans youth club, Cornwall Wildlife Trust and our local public transport group.

As well as being a great village day out, we had visitors from far and wide. Among our special guests was Lil and Glad's dad Fred, seen here with Dave. Sadly Fred died a few months later, so it was a great honour to us that he came. He has been a good friend and support to us over the years, and is greatly missed.

Our journey into holiday letting happened by serendipity; after finding a siding in our garden we decided to look for a carriage to use as a spare room for visiting friends. The OLV came from a builders yard in Liskeard. In our quest to recoup our investment we put an ad in Railways Illustrated. Within a year or so we'd appeared on BBC News and had a full calendar of bookings. When we started Lizzy was a few months pregnant with Walter. Poppy was on her way when our second carriage, Harvey, was moved to Hayle in July 2001. Walter is now doing a Phd in solar technology and Poppy is in her final year of a Fashion, Media and Marketing degree. How time flies.



Many of our regular guests have become good friends over the years. We've been lucky to have the support of our community too. We celebrated our jubilee by having a party with staff past and present, and other key people who've helped us along the way. Our lovely staff presented us with a beautiful glass trophy. And of course there was cake!

We've had some stories over the years, from the OLV being cordoned off by the bomb squad when a neighbour found a WW2 shell in their cellar, to a slug short-circuiting the electrics on the day of our Visit England judge's visit.
